Upper Clear Creek Watershed Association Meeting Minutes April 8, 2021

Call to Order/Establish Quorum

A regular meeting of the Upper Clear Creek Watershed Association was called to order at 8:32 am by Chair Ben Moline in GoToMeeting April 8, 2021. A quorum was declared established.

Agenda Approval

It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda as presented; motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the March 11, 2021 UCCWA meetings with the addition under referrals to reflect total parking spaces at 58; motion carried unanimously.

Secretary/Treasurer Report

The following invoices were presented for approval: Kielty Diversified Projects Inv# 504 for \$600.00 and Matrix Design Group Inv# 32893 for \$3,658.80. The invoices were within the budgeted/approved limits. It was moved and seconded to approve the invoices for payment totaling \$4,258.80; motion carried unanimously.

Water Quality Incident Reports

• The Clear Creek County Sheriff's office Dispatch Center reported on April 8th, 2021, a semitruck tanker coming down Loveland pass on Clear Creek County side was involved in a rollover accident. The tanker was leaking Sodium Hydroxide at a rate of 1 gallon per minute, into a ditch on the downhill side of the pass.

Presentations

• Molson Coors G150 project (Ben Moline) – 150th Anniversary of Golden brewery. The project goal is brewery transformation to meet 25% reduction in beer waste, 15% reduction in energy usage, 100 million gallons water reduction yearly, and 90% self-sufficient on CO₂. Their goal is to get to a 1:1 ratio, 1 pint of water to 1 pint of beer. A new tank farm will be built with fermentation tanks and aging tanks. The primary energy efficiency is related to the new fermentation tanks. The footprint will be greatly reduced. Scheduled to start production late 2023 / early 2024. They are building a flood control channel along the east side of Ford Street for circulation improvements. There will be new box culverts along 12th and 13th streets with vegetation. Along Ford Street the path will be widened with benches and two new bridges. There will be a low flow crossing at Main Street and a new bridge. Presentation is available by request.

- Pre-Fire Study Final Report Actions (Kerry Major, Drew Beck Matrix)
 - Host Site for GIS Data the Clear Creek Watershed Forest Health Partnership is
 presently an affiliate with COCO. COCO has a robust system for housing data and could
 house the UCCWA study data and make updates, temporarily. Member entities can have
 the data, but none want to be responsible for maintenance and upkeep. Please ask COCO

for a data sharing agreement and information about who has access. The data remaining on the COCO site would be contingent on CCWFHP remaining as an affiliate.

Action: Review COCO Data Sharing Agreement for a data housing decision during the May UCCWA meeting.

- CWRA Data Release Approvals & Management Effort to get data into the State decision support system. Have the UCCWA entities followed-up on this effort? The City of Northglenn has forwarded this information to the ditch companies. Please email Kerry Major if your organization decides to participate.
- Submission for Award CASFM (CO Association of Stormwater & Floodplain Managers) Matrix would like to submit the Pre-fire study for an award at the CASFM conference. Matrix would handle the paperwork to submit for consideration. The UCCWA membership is not opposed and believe it is worthy of submission.
