Call to Order/Establish Quorum

A regular meeting of the Upper Clear Creek Watershed Association was called to order at 8:33 am by Chair Kerry Major on March 10, 2022. A quorum was declared established.

Agenda Approval

It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda with additions of a review item from Idaho Springs under referrals and a CDOT question item under WQ incident reports; motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the February 10, 2022 UCCWA meeting; motion carried unanimously.

Secretary/Treasurer Report

• Idaho Springs Water Resource Reclamation Facility Chemical Metering Skid amendment of existing treatment plant site location approval. Michael Katalinich provided an update on a small community grant received for chemical metering equipment that is not needed for regulatory compliance but will improve processes and adjusting chemical uses. - Friends of Clear Creek have questions for CDOT about Magnesium chloride run-off into the streams coming from CDOT road maintenance. How is this being mitigated? CDOT will address this topic in their presentation at the April UCCWA regular meeting.

- Frei Quarry Update Al Frei, Jr., Albert Frei & Sons. A Presentation was provided and is available by request. Albert Frei & Sons holds community events and would like for UCCWA to participate. Provided an update on increasing product demand and materials being shipped greater distances. Discussed execution of their stormwater management plan. They have only had one discharge event in 5-years. They have been working with Clear Creek County on the Walstrum Spur to amend their ODP that would add 229 acres to the mining area. - **Russell Gulch Presentation** (*Attachment 5*) Lauren Duncan, Trout Unlimited. Discussed TU's role in WQ on abandoned mines throughout the state. Presented 2021 projects status and upcoming 2022 projects. Andrea and Greg Taillacq presented on the Russel Gulch Sediment

Study identifying primary sources of sediment in the gulch. The Young Ranch provided access for in-the-field evaluation. There are sediment control dams in place. The dams have limited capacity. Without maintenance there is a minimal dam life span. Provided overview on management strategies. Presentation available by request. - April 5th-6th, 2022 | Stormwater Control Measure Inspection and Maintenance Certification. The Colorado Stormwater Center provides a 1.5-day workshop on stormwater control measures (SCM) inspection and maintenance. All SCMs require regular maintenance to remain operating as designed. In this 1.5-day training workshop, we teach participants how to recognize SCM maintenance needs and how to perform maintenance correctly. The workshop includes 8 hours of presentations/discussion in a classroom setting, a 2-hour field trip and a 2hour written exam (optional).
