• Colorado Forest Restoration Institute QRA for the Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests. An Assessment is being conducted for the USFS and would help get areas within the

watershed that could impact our critical infrastructure on the USFS radar for future mitigation efforts. This study also goes further into fire modeling, which was not a huge part of the Matrix study and could benefit UCCWA members who could use this assessment for member modeling. CFRI understands the sensitive nature of the critical infrastructure data and it would only be used privately and internally with CRFI as they conduct the assessment.
